

Cameron Boyd (Santa Monica HS) is a 6-3 athletic & explosive combo guard who showed glimpses of what he is capable of. The high flying Boyd got to the rim at will. His play was hot & cold though and we're curious to see his development as he gets older and matures.

Wayne Arnold from Compton Dominguez HS is a 6-3 wing with a high vertical jump and a nice three-point shot. Wayne showed both talents all game

On the other squad was standout freshman Wes Slajchert, a 6-4 combo guard at Oak Park HS. Slajchert tore it up in this his freshman season. The showcas was a continuation of what he did all year at the varsity level alongside other 2018 Riley Battin (injured and could not play today).

Crespi has a set of 2018 PGs, **Brandon Williams** and **Taj Regans** that can flat out play. The 6-foot Williams can shoot the three and also put it on the floor. He's good both in transition and in the half court set. Regans is a hard nose tough PG that can shoot with range. Regans was hot from three-point land & came out ready to play.
