Pangos Frosh/Soph Camp kicks off in Norwalk

NORWALK, Calif — The annual Pangos All-West Frosh/Soph Camp has established a reputation of bringing many of the best freshman and sophomore high school basketball players under one roof.

In addition to the notable names in attendance were a number of “lesser-known” and “sleeper” type prospects looking to make a name for themselves.

One of the more interesting players on the day was 2018 point guard **Ronnie Green** out of Victorville (Calif.) Silverado High.

Green is an intense, fiery and vocal leader on the floor who works his tail off on the defensive side of the floor. He has a quick first-step, works well in pick-and-roll situations and can get to the basket where he can finish or draw the defense and dish to an open teammate.

Jamal Bey, a 6-foot-5 wing out of Las Vegas Bishop Gorman is another prospect who has seen his stock rise since the summer AAU circuit came to a close.

Bey has great size and feel for the two or three position and skill to boot. The sophomore played well for the Gaels last week in the Ron Massey Memorial Fall Hoops Classic - slashing to the basket for easy buckets and nailing perimeter jumpers - and had similar success Saturday night.

Much like the 2018 class, there were more than just the big-name 2019 prospects who stood out on Saturday and a player who could become a household name by the time his prep career is finished is Los Angeles Fairfax guard **Dijuan Chumack**.

Chumack has that true point guard feel all coaches search for in a one. He's smooth with the ball in his hands, has no wasted movement, moves the ball ahead in transition via the pass and can knock down mid-range and perimeter shots. Chumack needs to add strength to his wiry frame, but he's a prospect to keep an eye on moving forward.

Camarillo (Calif.) G/F **Jaime Jaquez, Jr.** is another freshman who impressed. Jaquez is as athletic as they come at 6-feet-5 and likes to get out in transition where he can lead the break and make plays for others or get wide and finish at the rim.
