OLU did everything but knock off Mater Dei this season. One of Coach Norstrom's most balanced teams with Joseph Riley, Zach Jervis, KaVaughn Scott and Chris Williams leading a potent offense that also played great team defense, especially in two wins against Santa Margarita.

Crean Lutheran




